

I. WHAT IS THIS PROJECT ALL ABOUT?

The stories we have been reading this term have captured the imagination of artists of all sorts over the centuries. In this project we will be taking the text we have read and expressing it using a different medium: comic strip/graphic novel. As you sit down to start this project, think about which of the stories we have read were to most interesting or even troubling to you. Once you have done this move onto the next step described below.

II. WHAT DO I HAVE TO DO?

- 1.) Pick a story that we have read since the mid-term (FR 14 – 19)
- 2.) Summarize the story using a minimum of 6 – 10 frames. There is no maximum limit.
- 3.) Provide a Latin caption describing what is happening for each frame that you draw. You have two options here: 1. take a sentence directly from the passage which illustrates what is happening in the frame 2. adapt a sentence from the passage in a way that it fits your caption
- 4.) Other considerations:
 - The paper you use must not be notebook paper – computer paper at a minimum
 - 8 ½ x 11 is fine, but you may want to go bigger to accurately capture the details you will be graded on (see below)
 - Stick figures are OK as long as they are showing the thought you put into summarizing the story that you chose
 - For other details on grading, see rubric below
