Ali- + Interrog. Pron. (aliquis, aliquid)

When acting as a noun: *someone, something; anyone, anything*

Example: will someone please kill me? [please: quaesō]

I will shave the head of anyone [shave: rado (3); head: caput, capitis (n.)]

When acting as an adjective: *some, any*

Example: During spring break the students drank some beer [During: use abl. time; spring break: fēriae vernalēs; beer: cervesia, ae (f)]

Rel. pron. + -dam (quīdam, quaedam, quoddam)

When acting as a noun: *a certain one*

as an adjective: *a certain*

Example: During spring break certain students drank some beer

Interrog pron.+ -que (quisque, quisque, quidque)

When acting as a noun: *each one, every one*

As an adjective: *each, every*

Example: During spring break every student drank some beer

NOTE: one difference between the two. See second column on p. 113

Interrog pron. + -quam (quisquam, quidquam)

As a noun: *someone, something, anyone, anything*

Example: During spring break someone was arrested [arrest: comprehendō (3)]
