<i>Less Real</i> SUBJUNCTIVE	NAME	TENSES USED	KEY WORDS FOR TRANSLATION
	Future Less Vivid	Present Subjv + Present Subjv	Should/Would e.g. If you should do X, I'll do Y
	Contrary To Fact Present	Imperfect Subjv + Imperfect Subjv (infinitive + pers. ending)	Were/Would e.g. If you were doing X, I would be doing Y
Contrary To Fact Past	Pluperf. Subjv. + Pluperf. Subjv. (perfect infinitive + pers. ending)	Had/Would have e.g. If you had done X, I would have done Y
