

PROBATIO II: What to expect

GENERAL: 4 sections – Vocabulary, Translation and reading, Grammar and Short answer.

VOCABULARY: 10 words, About half will be from words you have already seen on quizzes and the rest will be from words on the running vocab list that have not yet appeared (if any).

TRANSLATION AND READING: Includes two passages. One prepared passage and one sight passage. Prepared passage will be drawn from sections that we spent time in class reviewing, that were on reading quizzes or that you were assigned to translate. “sight” passage will be drawn from passages where you were assigned to only complete the comprehension questions.

GRAMMAR: Using passages from as early as ch. 63 and also from other activities, this section will ask you additional grammar questions. Grammar concepts that are fair game: impersonal verbs, indirect statement, differences in use of command verbs (e.g. iubeō vs. imperō or quaesō), sequence of tenses, rules for aliquis.

SHORT ANSWER: For this section of the test, you will turn in the section you have been working on in exchange for a sheet of paper with the following question written on it:

Using your text book (or any of the handouts), find two examples where any of the authors we have read uses the structure of the Latin language to reinforce the message that he is trying to convey. Each example **MUST** be accompanied by specific Latin evidence as discussed on Friday.

EXTRA CREDIT: Will be available after you submit the short answer sheet. Once you submit the short answer sheet, you will be able to collect a half sheet of paper detailing the available extra credit options.
