

1. Magister vaccam kisses/was kissing/(has) kissed/ will kiss
2. Ego filium meum warn/ was warning/ warned/will warn
3. Apud universitatem tu virum chase/ were chasing/ chased/ will chase
4. Apud universitatem illae fēminae virum seize/ was seizing/ seized/will seize
5. In balneō istum crepitum you (pl) hear/heard kept on hearing/have heard/will hear

### SEQUENCE OF TENSES

Main verb (**INDICATIVE**)

Use this **SUBJUNCTIVE** in the dep. clause to show *time*

<b>PRIMARY</b>	Present	1. Present	shows	same time as the main verb
	Future Future Perfect (Present Perfect) (Imperative)	Ex. Discipulī Magistrum audiunt ut Latinē discant.
